- ♦ *Hope of having a means to communicate.*
- ♦ *Hope of sitting, standing, and walking independently or with minimal assistance.*
- ♦ *Hopes of obtaining independent life skills such as dressing and grooming, toileting, grocery shopping, or preparing meals.*
- ♦ *Hopes of participating in activities and family outings just as his or her typically developing siblings.*
- ♦ *Hopes of gaining employment skills and securing a job as an adult.*

JSS provides hope for families and students by assisting families in refining their expectations and identifying goals that are functional and achievable; goals that can become realities and enable the child to be as independent in life as possible. Parents do not abandon dreams but simply turn them into those that are important to their child and to their family—hopes and dreams that truly matter!

However, some hopes remain unchanged. Hopes that a child will:

- ♦ *Live a happy and productive life*
- ♦ *Develop to his or her full potential*
- ♦ *Become a contributing and productive member of one's family and community*

After all, aren't these the hopes that we as parents and as community members have for all children?

We believe they are.

I hope you have a joyous holiday season filled with love, laughter, and joyous anticipation of things that can be.

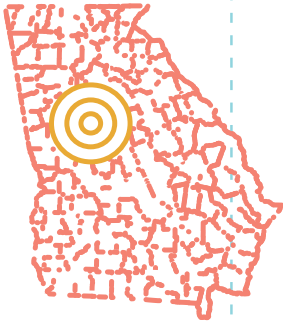

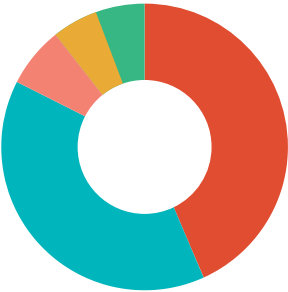

Student Ages








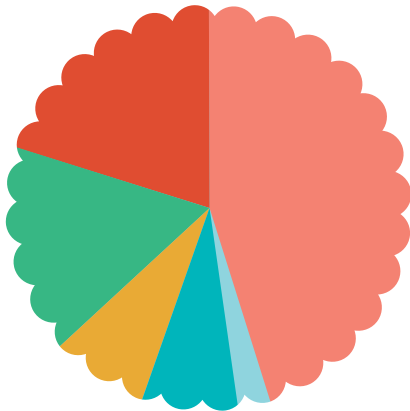

Student Spotlight

Hope. It is something that every parent has for their child from the moment they first discover a new life has begun. The hope for healthy prenatal development evolves into hope for things such as a successful career and a happy life with time; that hope never leaves. But for parents of special needs children, there is almost always an inevitable moment when that hope fades or goes completely dark. For us, that moment came while sitting in a developmental pediatrician's office in the year 2000 when the words "severely autistic" were used to diagnose our beautiful little blond-haired, blue-eyed two-year-old son, Charlie. Our reactions walking out of the office on that fateful day ranged from denial and anger from my husband to dismay and confusion for myself; the one thing we held in common was that the shining hope we had had for our child had just been diminished to a barely discernible flicker. Our journey into a dark unknown began with only instructions to "get our son into an intensive educational program that specializes in autistic children as early as possible". Needless to say, that isn't the type of instruction you just fill at the local pharmacy, and so our search began. Little did we know just two counties over there was a place

that would change all our lives, but especially Charlie's. Only a few months after his diagnosis, The Joseph Sams School not only restored the hope that dimmed for us that day, but ultimately put us on a journey of hope that we never knew could exist for children like our Charlie.

Flash forward 19 years, and the hope JSS helped to reignite that day continues to burn brighter than ever. Charlie, who graduated from JSS in May 2019, flourished during his 18 years at the school. Within a year of enrolling, the same developmental pediatrician who diagnosed Charlie as severely autistic changed his diagnosis to PDD (pervasive developmental delay) and expressed her amazement at how far he had come in such a short period. But we weren't amazed. Each day we witnessed the love, hard work, compassion, and determination that each and every staff member at JSS poured into Charlie. There was no other option out there that could touch what JSS gave our child, and that never changed in 18 years. As Charlie progressed from pre-k to elementary to primary to upper school and finally ATLAS (Adult Transitional Living and Support) we never once doubted he was where he needed to be. The toddler that could speak only two or three understandable words and was unable to maintain eye contact the day he entered JSS, walked out with the designation of "social butterfly" and as a volunteer reader in the younger children's classroom.

Today, life after JSS has begun. Armed with a resume and the skills he learned in ATLAS, Charlie is eager, ready, and looking for a job, preferably at Starbucks, if you ask him. He volunteers in the children's ministry at church and will soon be returning to volunteer in the classroom as a storytime reader at JSS. We don't know what else lies ahead as this new chapter has only just begun, but we do know Charlie is ready. The hope we once lost was not only restored, but more importantly, realized in large part thanks to the special place that is The Joseph Sams School.

We found that place in The Joseph Sams School. We were introduced to the school through a friend Kay had made through the many therapy sessions. She lived in Albany, Georgia, yet her daughter, who also has CP, was enrolled at JSS. We brought Will to the school for evaluation, and he was accepted into the program. Thirteen years later, he is now 20 years old, a student in the ATLAS upper school program, and just two years from graduation. He walks in a walker and Tram. He stands in a stander two hours each day. He drives a power chair all over the school. He paints. He plays in the chime choir. Not only does he communicate, but he talks and jokes all the time! In ATLAS, he is learning how to tell time, count and manage money, keep a checkbook, shop at the grocery store, operate a bake shop (his favorite day is when he is bake shop captain), and help out in the community. He also enjoys the ATLAS camping trips and the fishing, zip lining and rock wall climbing. Most important, he is happy, and he loves going to school! None of this would have been possible without our family at JSS and the ATLAS program.

Webster defines hope as "cherishing a desire with anticipation." Like any parent, Kay and I cherished with all our hearts our wish that our son Will would have a happy, productive and fulfilled life. That hope became a reality at JSS. I am reminded of one of my favorite verses from Isaiah 40:29-31. "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint." God is at work at JSS. The JSS family has given Will strength and power; he is walking and running; and he is definitely soaring on wings like eagles! Thank you JSS for giving us hope!

Kay and I recall so vividly how we felt when we found The Joseph Sams School 13 years ago for our son Will—HOPEFUL! And for the first time. Will was born at 25 weeks and weighed only 1 pound 11 ounces. When he was just a couple of weeks old, he had two grade 3-4 intraventricular hemorrhages. The blood caused significant damage to his brain tissue and necessitated brain surgery to implant a shunt. The doctors said Will would have cerebral palsy and likely would never be able to walk, care for himself, or even communicate. They gave us little reason to hope. After almost three months in the NICU, Will came home. With a lot of hard work, many therapies, multiple surgeries, and lots of medicines, Will progressed slowly – very slowly. It was easy to get discouraged. When Will was five years old, he started attending public school in DeKalb County. The public school system certainly did not give Kay and me reason for hope. The teachers were great and did their best, but the administrators pressured us to accept the lowest possible bar for Will to protect the school system. They were not at all interested in discovering what Will could do! After two years in the public school system, we knew we had to find a better school for Will. We needed a school with teachers and administrators who would not only care for him and nurture him, but push him to reach his highest potential and set the bar high—perhaps higher than he could possibly ever reach.

ATLAS

The ATLAS (Adult Transitional Living and Support) Program is a transition program serving 18-22 year olds. Our goal is to educate and equip our young adult learners with essential skills and community connections so that they may achieve their full potential, and live rich and meaningful lives.

ATLAS students participate in vocational training as well as volunteer and recreational opportunities. These experiences through the ATLAS Program give hope to our students and their families by helping them to develop and identify their aptitudes and interests so that they can become actively involved in their communities. This allows each student to work and live a productive and enjoyable life upon transitioning from The Joseph Sams School to adulthood.



Weekly at JSS, students work as a team to create the ATLAS Tribune as well as operate the ATLAS Bake Shop—a favorite for staff and students! In addition, students enjoy meeting with the JSS Alumni Association monthly.

In the community, students participate by dining out at local restaurants, utilizing various public venues, attending community activities, shopping at local stores, and working at job sites.

Current job and volunteer sites include: Chick-fil-A, Old Navy, Midwest Food Bank, Piedmont Hospital, Bloom Closet and The Clothes Less Traveled Thrift Shop.

Foundation Support

Throughout FY2019, financial contributions from local and area private foundations remained a vital aspect of our annual funding. Each year funds are solicited. Each year we are blessed to receive donations to support general operations, scholarships for students, program enhancements, and capital needs.

Funds in support of general operations are essential in order to keep our facility open, operational, and safe for our students and staff. Once again, we extend our heartfelt appreciation to a faithful supporter of JSS—**The Clothes Less Traveled Thrift Shop (CLT)**. CLT provided a total of \$29,000 for general operations—\$25,000 as an annual grant award and an additional \$4000 from the *Above and Beyond* awards program. Additional contributions in the amounts of \$5000 and \$7500 were received from both **The Ekkebus Charitable Foundation** and **The John and Mary Franklin Foundation**, respectively. We express a special thanks to all for supporting this vital area of need!

Making scholarship funds available to families continues to be a goal of JSS. We extend our gratitude to several foundations for their continued support of this ever increasing need. **The William R. and Sara Babb Smith Foundation** once again provided \$20,000 to provide tuition assistance to families from Henry County and **The Pennies From Heaven Foundation** contributed \$15,000 in support of needs-based scholarship aid. Additionally, **The John and Polly Sparks Foundation** provided \$10,000 to assist qualifying families who are experiencing unusual and/or extreme economic stresses. We are deeply appreciative of these generous gifts—gifts that provide hope for parents by enabling them to access quality programming for their children.

Ensuring that JSS offers the highest quality education for our students, funds are always needed to maintain, expand and enhance our special programs. This year, we received donations from two foundations to support the MOVE (Mobility Opportunity via Education/Experience) Program. **The Pediatric Foundation of Georgia** provided \$2000 for the purchase of 2 Dynamic Standers to use with our MOVE participants. **The Frances Wood Wilson Foundation** awarded \$5000 to expand and enhance the program to better serve our students with physical challenges.

As we continue our efforts to secure capital funds for constructing a new facility, we were thrilled to receive gifts of \$100,000 from **Coweta Fayette EMC** and \$5,000 from **The Hart Family Foundation**. These generous contributions were applied toward the purchase of property for our future campus.

To these foundations, we say “thank you”! Thank you for enabling JSS to continue its mission of providing the best possible education to children with unique and very special needs. *Thank you for helping to give our students hope for a bright and productive future!*

It costs you nothing but is a significant benefit to our students, as it ensures that families are able to access the therapies and services they so desperately need. This program offers a unique opportunity for you or your company to redirect your tax dollars to provide tuition assistance for Joseph Sams School students.

Since 2011, we have received over \$360,000 in scholarship revenues from The Apogee School Choice Fund which has allowed JSS to award 165 scholarships.

Needs based and flexible spending scholarship donations

Although scholarship donations are made at different times throughout the year, The Circle of Hope members continue to provide the bulk of our needs-based scholarship donations. The Circle of Hope is a Giving Society that was created in 2008 to help ensure that we had enough funding to be able to award scholarship monies to students whose families qualified for needs-based financial assistance with their annual tuition. Since its inception in 2008, The Circle of Hope members, and the Friends of the Circle of Hope (donors who make a straight cash donation less than \$1,000 to this fund), have provided over \$1.5 million in scholarship funding and have cumulatively provided 294 scholarships to JSS students and families who qualify for need-based assistance. Our 2019-2020 Circle of Hope members are an exceptional group of benefactors, and their contributions have been met with great admiration and appreciation.
