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A LETTER FROMOUR BOARD PRESIDENT

THE NEXT RIGHT THING

During our most recent Executive Committee Retreat, we invited Dr. Jim and Marie, and Ellen Nichol to remind us all of the beginning of The Joseph Sams School, essentially a refresher lesson of "the why." I firmly believe it is important not to dwell in the past, but I also understand that to better know where you are going, you ought to know where you have been. Dr. Jim put a lot into perspective when he talked to us about doing "the next right thing." This seems like a pretty good framework for understanding our purpose as a school and moving forward to impact as many lives as possible, while continuing to expand the levels of community support.

With 73 students enrolled for the 2023/24 school year, our current waiting list stands at 15 students, necessitated by both staffing and space requirements. The next right thing is to continue recruiting high quality and high-level staff while also determining the best option for solving the physical space needs to serve more students and help them excel.

As an executive committee, we are committed to helping write the next chapter by focusing on quality growth as a board with new board and executive committee members that can help maximize the growth potential of The Joseph Sams School with varying levels of expertise and influence. Our succession plan will include at least 4 new board members each year with expectations to roll up the sleeves and contribute to the various board committees, as well as being willing to serve as executive committee officers and officers elect to offer better continuity of leadership.

Not only do we have to focus on growth of the current school, but we are branching out finally with an Adult Day Program, something that has been in the discussion and planning stages for awhile but is finally ready to be realized. In growing the school and expanding our services to adults, the next right thing will be the implementation of a building program to house both programs, preferably on one campus and under one roof. As a board, we understand we can no longer simply talk about it; we have to take action in the coming months to meet the space needs required for the school and the Adult Day Program to flourish.

We continue to rely on the generous support of all of our current donors and friends of the school, but we know it is particularly important to the longevity of the school to grow the brand and expand the JSS name, allowing new donors to come alongside and help to further the mission of JSS. It may be hard to imagine, but there are people in Fayette County who have never heard of the school or our mission, much less all of the surrounding counties. For this reason, we are planning the next right thing, a more aggressive marketing venture to help make The Joseph Sams School more of a household name and to explain "The Why" by telling the story.

Before I took my family to The Grand Canyon several years ago several people told me that pictures do it no justice. Once there and absolutely awestruck by the magnitude and majesty of that natural wonder, I understood what everyone was talking about and felt emotionally overwhelmed. The same goes for visiting JSS on a school day; people can hear our stories about the school, the staff, the kids or even go to a fundraising event and hear personal testimonies from parents and grandparents of our students, but there is nothing quite like seeing it live and in person. I would encourage anyone who has not been, to stop by on a school day, and if you have been but know someone who has not, offer to go with them and consider it your next right thing in helping to share the JSS story.



SENSORY ROOM

Our school is proud to announce the creation of a new sensory room, which was made possible thanks to the support of the Becky Mowell Arnall Memorial Endowment. The sensory room is tailored to meet the individualized needs of each student, providing a calming, stimulating environment that enhances the support of our classrooms and programs. The room is equipped with calming lights, soothing sounds, tactile surfaces, and sensory tools and equipment, creating a truly multi-sensory experience. These resources are essential in helping our students navigate their school and community settings, providing a supportive environment that allows them to thrive and succeed. This addition is a testament to the school's ongoing commitment to doing "the next right thing."

JSS VOLUNTEERS

There are many ways to volunteer at JSS. Volunteers can read a book to a class, assist with class activities, serve as a lunch buddy, help teachers prepare materials, and much more. A majority of our volunteers at JSS are former students. Volunteering provides an opportunity for these young adults to continue to be active in their community. This sense of giving back can be incredibly fulfilling and can positively impact their self-worth. It reinforces the powerful message that everyone, regardless of their abilities, has a valuable role to play in their community.





ATLAS ALUMNI

Our ATLAS (Adult Transitional Living and Support) program serves our students who are approximately 18-22 years old and preparing for what is next after they graduate from JSS. The relationship doesn't end after graduation! Young adults who have graduated from our ATLAS program are invited to meet up for social events throughout the year with the current ATLAS class. Once a month, the ATLAS students send a letter to our Alumni informing them of current events in school, wishing "Happy Birthday" for each month, and inviting them to the next event. These ATLAS Alumni events can include going out to lunch, going bowling, seeing a movie, and more! Continuing to foster relationships is important even after students graduate from JSS. The students love to hear what their friends are doing at their jobs, what trips they've taken, or how their families are doing. They truly care about each other!

JSS has positively impacted my son and family by offering many opportunities to learn life skills. With JSS staff members' assistance, I feel more confident in Eden's abilities to interact within the community independently.

DIGITAL DATA TRACKING

Tracking data is an important part of every day at JSS. It allows us to monitor progress, adjust instruction, and ensure each student is moving forward towards their goals. This year, JSS has begun using a digital data tracking system, AbleSpace. Staff are able to access and take data on all of their students' goals from their tablets with a simple click. Whether collected by a speech-language pathologist, teacher, or paraprofessional, all the data is compiled in one place for every student. AbleSpace provides a graph, statistics, as well as an average for each goal that is customizable by the instructor and range of dates. This feature allows our staff members to maximize their time with the ease of analyzing the data. Staff are able to share with our families during meetings in a way that is concise and comprehensive, as AbleSpace allows for pictures of work samples to be included, as well as notes.



Joey's Club is a program that welcomes the siblings of our students and staff's children in our preschool and pre-k classrooms. The purpose is to create a reverse inclusion opportunity that allows children of all abilities to learn and grow together in a supportive environment. Joey's Club students serve as peer models, fostering friendships and meaningful connections that enrich the lives of everyone involved, creating a sense of community. Our priority is always the well-being of our students, families, and staff, cultivating a compassionate and supportive environment.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

THOMAS & HARPER HARP



The Joseph Sams School has been a part of our family for three years. We first heard about JSS from our Pediatrician. The boys were 6 years old when I first reached out to the school. They provided me with information and positive feedback that helped guide us to the next right thing. At that time, we felt JSS was not right, so after the 2019-2020 school year, the boys started at the Marcus Institute. After six months, Harper was ready to leave and begin his journey at JSS. Thomas would stay at Marcus for another year before making his transition to JSS.



The relationships formed with staff at JSS over the years have made a profound impact on our family. Harper and Thomas made instant friends and connections. It didn't take them long to adjust to their new school. We could see an immediate improvement in behaviors. Tantrums were less aggressive and less frequent. Both starting to wait for longer periods of time and were even able to leave stem toy in the car at drop off. For me there was an instant connection the first day I met the staff. I knew I wanted Harper and Thomas to go here. As a parent it's so important to trust the people taking care of your children. When we drop them off, we do not worry about them because we know they are in great hands.

A major concern for our family and most families is the cost of tuition. The question comes up can we afford this? When this was discussed all of my fears and doubts about not being able to afford the school was removed. I was told I would be responsible for a portion of tuition but that there was resources and scholarship funding available for families with financial hardships. It was such a relief to know money would not deny Harper and Thomas from the next right thing.





CIRCLEOF HOPE

SCHOLARSHIP GIVING SOCIETIES

Although scholarship donations are made at various times throughout the year, The Circle of Hope members continue to provide the bulk of our needs-based scholarship donations. The Circle of Hope is a Giving Society that the organization created in 2008 to help ensure funding was available to award scholarships to students whose families qualified for needs-based financial assistance with their annual tuition.

To qualify for The Circle of Hope, members give \$1000 or more in a cash donation during the year. Friends of the Circle of Hope are those who are donors who give less than \$1000 a year. These two giving societies combined have provided more than \$1.9 million in scholarship funding and more than four hundred seventy scholarships to JSS students and families since its inception. Our 2022-2023 Circle of Hope members have grown to an extraordinary group of benefactors and their contributions are met with the upmost appreciation and admiration.
